



An initiative to provide safe drinking water





The water crisis in the Malwa region of Punjab which is also known as the 'Cancer belt of Punjab" has become dire, with an increasing impact on the health of the population residing in these villages. Over-dependence on fertilizers and pesticides, geogenic contamination and human activities have led to massive contamination of the groundwater resources in south-west Punjab. Studies show that the level of contamination, trace metals, and TDS have exceeded the acceptable limits for drinking water in most of the districts in Punjab. A study conducted by the Department of Drinking Water Supply and Sanitation (DWSS) in 2010 in Punjab showcased the presence of trace elements higher than the acceptable limits. They were heavy metals such as lead, chromium, cadmium, nickel, aluminum, arsenic, and uranium. These contaminants gives birth to different types of cancer and other diseases like hepatitis, nervous system disorder, kidney damage etc. This region covers 14 out of the 23 districts of Punjab.

Recognizing the urgency of the situation, we have undertaken a crucial intervention to address the water crisis in rural areas of the Malwa region. Through the installation of Water Purification Units (WPUs), we aim to provide immediate access to safe drinking water for the affected population. These WPUs utilize advanced purification technology to remove contaminants and ensure that the water meets quality standards for consumption.

Since the inception of our intervention, Joti Foundation has made significant strides in providing access to safe drinking water in the Malwa region. To date, we have successfully installed six water purification units in districts of Sri Muktsar Sahib and Fazilka. These units serve as lifelines for the community, providing safe drinking water to approximately 30,000 people daily.


 Heavy metals contamination in drinking water/groundwater is at a higher concentration than the WHO permissible limit. There have been reports of premature greying of hair, premature ageing and excessive cancer death in Jajjal village of Bathinda

 The most common symptoms of arsenicosis is dermatological which include dark/white pigmentation and gradual hardening of palms and soles along with appearance of hard nodular lesions.

 High concentration of uranium can cause severe kidney problems, lung infection, autoimmune disorder, high blood pressure, reproductive system problems, and cancer. The groundwater of the Malwa region comes in the category of very hardwater and unfit for drinking. The concentration of uranium in the region's groundwater ranges from 13.9 to 172.8 µg/l

Cancer, Arthritis, Sinusitis, Anemia, Arsenicosis, Lead Poisoning, Methaemoglobinemia, Fluorosis, and kidney-related problems are common across the Malwa region of Punjab.

Studies linked arsenic with leukaemia, diabetes, neurological effects, cardiac disorders, congenital disabilities and reproductive organs.



The impact of our intervention extends beyond the provision of safe water. By addressing a fundamental need for clean drinking water, we are safeguarding the health and well-being of communities, reducing the prevalence of waterborne diseases, and alleviating the burden of medical expenses associated with water-related illnesses. Additionally, access to safe water promotes economic stability by improving productivity and reducing healthcare costs.

CLEARER VISION FOR BRIGHTER FUTURE

Aims at providing free of cost spectacles to all the government school children of Punjab



In August 2024, we embarked on a transformative journey with the launch of the 'Clearer Vision for Brighter Future' initiative. This ground breaking program was designed to address a pressing issue affecting the educational landscape of Punjab – the prevalence of weak eyesight among government school children. Recognizing the profound impact visual impairment can have on a child's learning capacity, Joti Foundation took proactive steps to provide comprehensive eye care services to enhance the educational outcomes of these children.

The initiative is to conduct mega screenings for approximately 29,00000 government school children across Punjab. Through these screenings, the we aimed to identify students with vision impairments and provide them with free-of-cost spectacles, thereby enabling them to access the education they deserve without hindrance.

The implementation of the 'Clearer Vision for Brighter Future' initiative involved meticulous planning and coordination at every stage. Joti Foundation collaborated with government authorities, educational institutions, and healthcare professionals to ensure the seamless execution of the program. Camps were set up in each school of the districts, reaching even the most remote areas to ensure that no child was left behind.



Additionally, partnerships were established with optical suppliers to procure high-quality spectacles suitable for the diverse needs of the children.

The impact of the initiative was profound and far-reaching. By conducting mega screenings and providing free spectacles, Joti Foundation significantly improved the visual health of thousands of government school children.

One such poignant story is that of Sukhchain, a bright young boy whose potential was hindered by untreated vision problems. During our screening process, Sukhchain was found to have a severe vision impairment, with a prescription of 6 diopters, yet he was not wearing spectacles due to his family's financial constraints.

In this journey we came across hundreds of children like Sukhchain and transformed their lives through this initiative. In the FY 2023–2024 we covered various districts such as Sri Mukstar Sahib, Bathinda, Fazilka and Sangrur and screened more than 250000 children. Amongst these we identified and provided spectacles to over 10,000 children.

The provision of corrective eyewear not only enhanced their ability to see clearly but also contributed to their overall well-being and academic performance. Moreover, by addressing vision impairments at an early stage, the initiative helped prevent long-term complications and potential dropout rates due to undiagnosed visual problems.

Beyond providing direct services, we also prioritized community engagement and awareness-building efforts. In this initiative we gave a very significant role to the teachers of the districts. Through proper workshops and training we educated teachers how to do initial screenings with the help of Snellen chart. This made teachers a very important part of the entire project and worked towards sensitizing them about this cause.



DISASTER RELIEF

Responded to Punjab floods



In August, Punjab was faced with one of the most devastating floods in recent memory, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake and impacting the lives of countless individuals and families. As floodwaters inundated vast swathes of land, leaving countless families displaced and livelihoods destroyed, we mobilized our expert teams to provide immediate assistance. Recognizing the urgency of the situation, our teams sprang into action, deploying motor rafts to facilitate evacuations and deliver crucial medical aid to those stranded in the floodwaters.

In the days that followed, as access to remote villages became increasingly challenging due to flooded roads and infrastructure damage, we adapted our approach, utilizing waterways to reach isolated communities. Despite the logistical hurdles, our teams navigated treacherous waters to deliver essential supplies, including ration packs and other vital items, to those in need.

Through our concerted efforts, we were able to make a tangible difference in the lives of thousands of flood-affected individuals and families. By providing evacuation facilities, medical aid, and essential supplies to 3000 households across five villages, we alleviated immediate suffering and offered a glimmer of hope amidst the devastation.

Moreover, our response efforts extended beyond mere relief provision, as we remained committed to supporting communities in their long-term recovery and rebuilding efforts. By prioritizing the most vulnerable populations and ensuring equitable distribution of resources, we sought to foster resilience and empower communities to chart a path towards recovery and renewal.

In implementing Project Empower-ED, collaboration was key. We engaged with district administration, education departments, and school authorities to identify meritorious yet underprivileged children deserving of support.




We ensured that scholarships were awarded to those with the greatest need and potential for academic success.
